



- 100 % of public universities do not charge tuition fees!








Higher Education Institutions


Companies and Industrial Research

- Almost 70% of the research investments in Germany are spent by the industrial sector (approx. 56 billion euros)
- Numerous industrial research facilities and companies are closely cooperating with universities and other research institutions like Fraunhofer, Helmholtz, Leibnitz
- The German Federation of Industrial Research Associations (AiF) promotes research and development in all industry sectors
- Industries strong in research: Automobile industry, electrical engineering, chemical industry and mechanical engineering

Companies with the highest R&D spending in Germany (in million euros, 2012)








Different ways of doing a PhD in Germany





What do I need to know about an individual doctorate?

- 1. Search for a suitable institute at a university
- 2. Find a doctoral supervisor (so called "Doktorvater/Doktormutter")
- 3. Contact supervisor via E-Mail or formal letter:
 - brief description of field and topic of interest
 - CV (résumé or profile) and short review of relevant experience
 - Letters of recommendation
- 4. Admission as a doctoral student by the relevant department
- Write a research paper (dissertation or thesis)
- 6. Take an oral exam (rigorosum or disputation)



What do I need to know about a structured programme?

- Based on the Anglo-American doctoral studies model
- Currently over 700 structured PhD programmes
- Compulsory attendance at lectures or seminars and interim assessment (credit points)
- Students work steadily on their research project with a team and support from a group of academic staff
- Lectures and seminars accompany the research training (academic and scientific methods, soft skills, presentation techniques)
- Cooperation agreements between university, research institute and/or industrial companies
- Structured programmes are offered by universities, DFG research training groups, DFG graduate schools, International Max Planck-Research Schools (IMPRS), Helmholtz Association, Fraunhofer-Gesellschaft

Selecting a research project	I would like to choose my own doctoral subject. I would like to study for my doctorate with a specific researcher.	I prefer thematic integration in a doctoral or research programme.
Organisation	I enjoy working independently and taking responsibility for my work. I would like to plan how I use my time myself. I would like to primarily concentrate on my research topic. I will attend selected subject seminars, if necessary.	I would like to regularly exchange ideas with colleagues. I would prefer to be integrated in a specific project or have a fixed curriculum. I would like my doctoral study to have a definite timeframe. I would like to receive support with articles, lectures or participation in conferences. I would like to deepen my subject knowledge and key skills in seminars.

Graduate schools are funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG) and offer ideal conditions for doctoral students within a broad scientific area.

Doctoral Training Programmes www.helmholtz.de

In collaboration with various institutions of higher education, Helmholtz Association research centres have established structured PhD programmes under the auspices of Helmholtz Graduate Schools and Helmholtz Research Schools.

List of Research Training Groups www.dfg.de

Research Training Groups are also funded by the DFG for a period of up to nine years.

Max Planck Research Schools www.mpg.de

Because the Max Planck Society (MPG) specialises in innovative basic research, its institutes are able to offer up-and-coming researchers excellent infrastructure and support.

In many cases, doctoral students work as research associates (paid PhD position) at German universities, in a research training groups or at a non-university research institute.

Funding for phd students


Many German funding organizations support highly talented international PhD students. As a rule, the prerequisite is an above-average first degree.





DAAD Individual Scholarship Programm

Intensive Language Courses in Germany

- How long? 2 months
- Who? Students of all disciplines (BA, MA, PhD)
- When? Between June and December
- Students of German studies excluded!
- Requirements: Just A1-Knowledge of German (up to A2)!
- 2 years completed at university
- Value: 2300 €, travel allowence, payments towards health, accident and personal liability insurance
- Application Deadline: 01.12.2015

IMPORTANT: Students have to be enrolled at a Serbian university during the course!



University Summer Courses in Germany

- How long? 3-4 weeks at German Universities
- Who? Students of all disciplines (BA, MA)
- Requirements: Good knowledge of German > B1
- 2 years completed at university
- Application Deadline: 01.12.2015
- Value: 1025 €, travel allowence, Payments towards health, accident and personal liability insurance

IMPORTANT: Students have to be enrolled at a Serbian University during the course!



Study Scholarships for Graduates of ALL Disciplines

- Target group: Graduates (BA) of all disciplines
- Requirements:
 - University degree (BA), very good gpa
 - English degree program: very good knowledge of English
 - German degree program: good knowledge of German
 - Admission to German university at the **beginning** of the scholarship Application Deadline: 15.11.2015
- Tip: Motivation Letter is very important!
- 10-24 months, depending on programme; start: 1 Oct 2016
- Value: Scholarship payments of 750 euros a month, Payments towards health, accident and personal liability insurance cover Travel allowance, One-off study allowance, tuition fees up to 500 euros per semester



Study Scholarships for Foreign Graduates

- in the Field of Architecture
- in the Field of Music
- in the Field of the Performing Arts
- in the Fields of Fine Art, Design/Visual Communication and Film

A Portfolio has to be submitted!

Application Deadline: 31.10.2015

02/2016: Interviews

04/2016: Announcement of the results /

Letter of award

Applying at University

03-07/2016: Application phase at Universities start

05-08/2016: Letter of Admission from the universities

Receiving a DAAD Scholarship, doesn't mean to get admission at university!



Research Grants

- Who can apply? Excellently-qualified young academics and scientists who have completed a Master's degree or Diploma
- **■** Three types:
 - Doctoral Programms in Germany (structured or individual up to 3 years)
 - 1 year grants or short term grants (1-6 month)
- For What? A research project or course of continuing education at a university or a nonuniversity research institute in Germany, which is being carried out in coordination with an academic adviser in Germany.
- Application Deadline: 15.11.2015
- Value: Depending on academic level, monthly payments of: euros 750,- for graduates,
 euros 1.000,- for doctoral candidates



Research Stays for University Academics

and Scientists

- Who can apply? University teachers and established academics and scientists who have usually completed a doctoral degree and work at a university or research institute in their home country.
- Duration: 1- 3 month
- Value: Monthly payments of
 2,000 euros for assistant teachers, assistant professors and lecturers
 2,150 euros for professors
- Application Deadline: 15.11.2015
- Travel allowance



Study Visits for Academics - Artists and Architects

- The aim of this programm is to promote artistic cooperations with German host institutions.
- Who can apply? University teachers from the following disciplines: Architecture, Fine Art, Film, Design/Visual Communication, Performing Arts, Music
- Duration: One to three months
- Value: Monthly payments of
 2,000 euros for assistant teachers, assistant professors and lecturers,
 2,150 euros for professors

Travel allowance



DAAD Project Funding

Study Trips to Germany

Study Visits / Study Seminars and Practicals in Germany, headed by an university teacher

Duration: 7-12 days

Guests (10-15 persons) will be paid a flat-rate sum of 50 euros per participant and day as a subsidy towards their travel and subsistence costs (practical)

Deadline: 1.11. each year → start: 1.03.

Deadline: 1.02. each year → start: 1.06.

Deadline: 1.05. each year \rightarrow start: 1.09.
